THE OTHER SIDE OF THE MIRROR / AL OTRO LADO DEL ESPEJO EXPLORES CENTURIES OF HISTORY BETWEEN SAN ANTONIO, TX AND QUERÉTARO, MX

*Groundbreaking art exhibit at the Museo de Arte de Querétaro and KLRN documentary
showcases San Antonio artists, historians and storytellers, beginning on
Friday, September 20, 2024*

SAN ANTONIO, TX – While many people know that the San Antonio Missions, including the Alamo, were built under the supervision of Spanish missionaries, it is less known that these missionaries came from Querétaro, Mexico, where they were trained. This began an over 300-year binational cultural relationship between these two cities. To commemorate that history, the City of San Antonio, Alamo Colleges Foundation, local philanthropists and corporations, have assembled a groundbreaking art exhibit debuting September 20, 2024 at the prestigious Museo de Arte de Querétaro.

The exhibit, titled *The Other Side of the Mirror / Al Otro Lado del Espejo*, is organized by renowned artists Lionel and Kathy Sosa and Museo de Arte de Querétaro Director Antonio Arelle Barquet. It will bring San Antonio Latino artists, along with scholars, photographers, ceramists, poets and historians, to share their experiences and artistic inspiration with their Mexican counterparts. Jesse Treviño, Alfredo Rodriguez, Jacinto Guevara, Cristina Sosa Noriega, Ito Romo, Terry Ibañez, Celeste De Luna, and Cruz Ortiz are among the 23 artists included in the exhibit, which will run through January 31, 2025.

“When two spirits from different places join together in a piece of art, I think that is one of the most beautiful things that can happen to people,” shares Antonio Arelle Barquet. “Because they see on the other side of the mirror what their brothers and sisters are living on the other side of the border.”

Coinciding with the grand opening of the exhibit, leaders from both Queretaro and San Antonio will be signing a Friendship City agreement, the first step to a future Sister City designation. There will also be educational programming and workshops that are open to the public, exploring the cultural linkages between San Antonio and Querétaro. Additionally, five outstanding students from the Alamo Colleges District will have the opportunity to participate in an educational exchange program, immersing them in the arts and culture of Querétaro, Mexico.

“People in Querétaro and in San Antonio have been creating connections through history, culture, heritage, education and business. These linkages on both sides of the border are strong and have been strong through the ages,” said San Antonio Mayor Ron Nirenberg.

To further highlight participating artists and dive deeper into the hidden history of San Antonio’s founding, a four-part documentary by the same name will run for four weeks on Thursday evenings at 7:30pm on KLRN-TV starting on October 17th. The documentary will focus on the historical ties between the two cities, including the missions, and how they impact the identity and culture of San Antonio today.

With the San Antonio International Airport offering non-stop flights twice weekly, travel to Querétaro for *The Other Side of the Mirror / Al Otro Lado del Espejo* exhibit is encouraged. However, those unable to make the trip can expect to see accompanying events and programming in San Antonio. The Querétaro Art Museum

The Querétaro Art Museum, known as MAQRO, was inaugurated on September 22, 1988 in the former Cloister of San Agustín. Its construction dates back to the 18th century and in 1987 it was declared Cultural Heritage by decree of former President Miguel de la Madrid. It has a New Spain baroque courtyard that is considered one of the most beautiful in Latin America. Currently, after some restorations, it has exhibition halls with permanent and temporary displays that house works spanning from the 17th to the 19th century.
